	Who can apply?	If you meet the following criteria, you are eligible to apply:
		 Citizen of any of the 51 Asia-Europe Meeting (ASEM) partner countries
		• A secondary, vocational or high school teacher or educator
		 Proficient English skills (oral and written)
		 Basic knowledge of E-learning and a keen interest in expanding it
		 Passion for sharing, exchanging information and good practices in education
		 Desire to cooperate with schools in Asia and Europe in an Online Collaboration
	What are the steps for a smooth application process?	For us to consider your application, please bear in mind the following steps:
		1. Submit the online application here with completed information.

	I am a non-ASEM country national working in an ASEM country. Am I eligible to apply?	No. Only nationals of the 51 Asia-Europe Meeting (ASEM) partner countries are eligible to apply.

FEES	Is there a participation fee?	There are no participation & registration fees required for the conference.
LODGING & MEALS	Do the organisers provide accommodation during the event?	Co-organisers will provide accommodation for the participants who are travelling from abroad for the following dates: Arrival, Friday, 8 September 2017 to Departure, Monday, 11 September 2017 .
	Do the organisers provide meals?	Meals will be provided to all participants during the conference as indicated in the programme.
	I have special dietary requirements, will this be an issue?	For participants who have special dietary requirements, the organisers will make arrangements as much as possible to adjust the meals accordingly.
TRAVEL, VISA & INSURANCE	What about the travel costs?	The organiser will be able to provide travel subsidy to participants, who need financial assistance to support their travel costs (return flight/train from country of residence to Zug, Switzerland). This travel subsidy will be based on a reasonable capped amount defined by the organisers. The amount will be announced to the selected participants in the confirmation letter. This travel subsidy will be disbursed after the Conference and only upon submission of all the required documents. Should the documents submitted do not comply with the pre-requisite requirements, the organisers reserved the right to revoke the travel subsidy reimbursement.

TRAVEL, VISA & INSURANCE	How about visa fees and insurance?	Visa fee (if applicable) could be covered on top of the capped subsidy. Insurance is considered personal liability and the organisers will not cover the costs in this context. All participants are encouraged to purchase their own travel insurance.
